Highlights of the Tour:

Batu Caves and Hindu Temple



A limestone outcrop located just north of Kuala Lumpur, The Batu Caves complex is one of the most cherished historical religious attractions in Malaysia. This is a site of a Hindu temple and shrine dedicated to Lord Murugan. Batu Caves has three main caves led by a steep 272 steps stairs climb, however its main attraction is the large statue of the Hindu God at the entrance.

National Palace



Also known as Istana Negara, this is the official residence of the current King of Malaysia. The complex is not open to the public, nonetheless it is a very impressive complex with its gold coloring and 22 domes. Visitors are only able to catch a photo along Jalan Duta from outside its entrance gates. This palace was only built in 2011, and the former palace was converted to a museum.

National Memorial and Parliament House



The National Monument is the world's tallest bronze freestanding sculpture grouping, Built in 1966 to commemorate those who died in Malaysia's struggle for freedom, principally against the Japanese occupation during the World War II. Located close by, is the Malaysian Houses of Parliament.



Central Market



Central Market Kuala Lumpur has come a long way from its early beginning as a wet market built in 1888 to a delightful destination for tourists, shoppers and art lovers. Visitors can experience craft-making demonstrations and get a picture drawn by local artists. Lunch stop here at Precious Old China restaurant serving Nyonya Food.

Dataran Merdeka & KL City Gallery



Independence Square: It was here the Union Flag was lowered and the Malayan flag hoisted for the first time at midnight on 31 August 1957. KL city gallery located opposite tells the story of Kuala Lumpur's Past, Present and Future through miniatures.



Royal Selangor Pewter Factory



The business was set up in 1885 by a pewtersmith named Yong Koon who, as a young man, migrated from China to Malaya along with thousands of his compatriots to join Malaya's tin rush. Today, Royal Selangor Pewter is well known for its high quality craftsmanship in terms of pewter which makes good gifts and home decorations for individuals all over the world. Visitors will get to experience the history of Royal Selangor.
